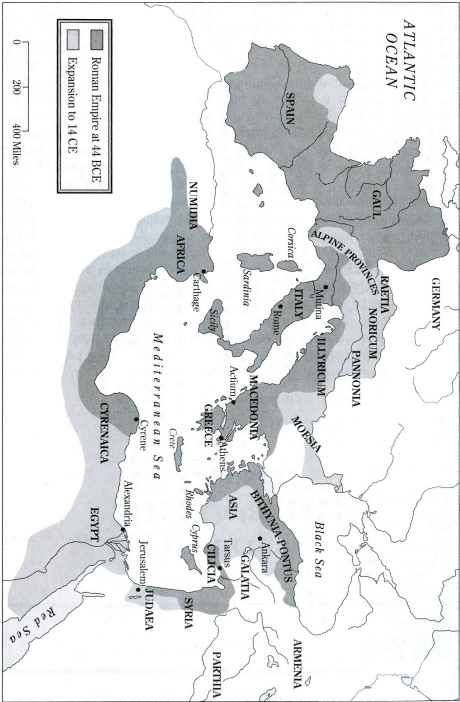


Document A: Map

**Context:** The denarius was a silver coin used in the Roman Empire. On the front side of the coin is the head of Octavian and the inscribed word "CAESAR." 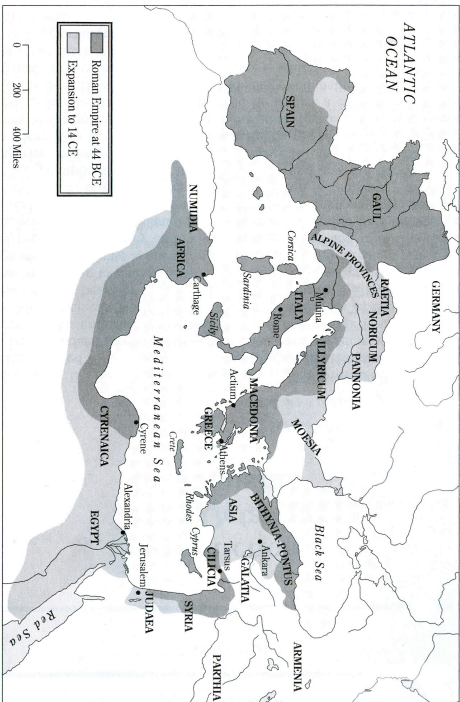


BACK OF COIN
