We played the video game "Mission US: For Crown or Colony" in class, (www.mission-us.org) Episode 1 a role-playing game about Patriots and Loyalists in Boston, MA around the time of the Boston Massacre in 1770.

In a **five paragraph essay**: identify one character from the game "For Crown or Colony?" and explain whether this character is a loyalist, patriot or neutral. **All the evidence** included should come from the video game and be cited accordingly. For example: "This character refuses to sell British tea. (For Crown or Colony, Part 2)." Please thoroughly explain the evidence you include to explain why the character is a loyalist, patriot or neutral.

Some possible characters: Hugh White, Royce Dillingham, Mr. Edes, Constance Lille, Phyllis Wheatley or others.
